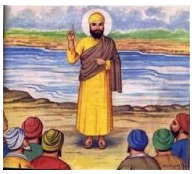


Guru Nanak was taken to see God. God said to him 'There is neither Hindu nor Muslim'. From then on he called himself Guru Nanak Das (Slave of God).



At 30, Guru Nanak went to bathe in the river as usual. But he disappeared. He went missing for three days.



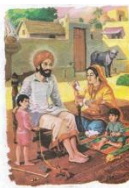
Guru Nanak died in 1539 and said that Lehna (one of his followers) was to be the next Guru. He called him Guru Angad, which means 'part of me'.

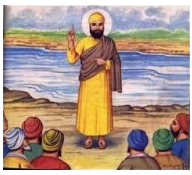

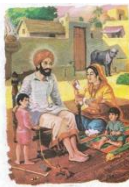
