



There are a range of objections that have been raised to conservatism by liberals, socialists, and others. One might argue that, as an empirical fact, different levels of social hierarchies are less accessible than conservatives claim. That, in many societies, the status of your parents determines your status, that people are not able to actually move out of the caste they were born into. For some societies this is written into law. For others it is merely an empirical fact. Such a concern might give us reason to think that hierarchies where some have ill-gotten gains while others are forced into servitude for no reason than the parents they were born to are immoral and that conservatism is merely a fool's philosophy designed to keep the poor subservient.

not concerned to restore what has been lost








Reactionary politics

to preserve that which is valuable






Glorious Revolution (1689)
