



State


- liberal democracy

- (illegitimate exercise of arbitrary power)






Thomas Hill Green

1836-1882

Green supported

- 1. regulation of labour contracts to limit workplace hours and factory conditions
- 2.greater opportunities for agricultural workers to own land
- 3. public health and safety regulations
- 4. education reforms, improving access to elementary, secondary, and higher education, regardless of socioeconomic status
- 5. the improvement of educational and economic opportunities for women
