"But whoever of you is ill or on a journey, then let them fast an equal number of days after Ramaḍan." (Qur'an 2:184)

This means that if you're sick or traveling during Ramadan, the special month when Muslims fast, it's okay not to fast then. You can make up for those missed days by fasting later.

"Take the standing-place of Abraham as a site of prayer." (Qur'an 2:125)

This is talking about a specific place where Abraham, an important prophet, used to pray. Muslims are encouraged to visit this place and pray there too.

"Glorify the praises of your Lord and be someone of those who always pray." (Qur'an 15:98)

This means that we should always remember to praise Allah and make prayer a regular part of our lives.

"Recite what has been revealed to you of the Book and establish prayer." (Qur'an 29:45)

This reminds us to read the Quran, the holy book of Islam, and to pray regularly.

"Fight in the way of Allah those who fight you but do not transgress." (Qur'an 2:190)

This reinforces the idea that it's okay to fight back if you're being attacked unjustly, but only to defend yourself.
